Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of the Year 7 transition into high school, a camp has been organised for all students to attend. The camp is an opportunity for students to develop friendships and positive interactions amongst their peers, Year 10 Peer Support Leaders and teachers.

Students will be participating in The Great Aussie Bush Camp – Tea Gardens, which is facilitated by trained professionals delivering outdoor recreation-based teaching and learning programs. The Camp provider is a registered COVID Safe Business which adheres to the NSW Governments COVID Safe business program. Travel to and from the camp will be by bus and the students will be accompanied and supervised by four teachers. There are a number of forms that need to be completed for your child to attend and these are included in this package.

This camp will involve a variety of land and aquatic activities, such as abseiling, high ropes, canoeing, raft building and an obstacle course. Your child will be required to wear a life jacket when participating in aquatic activities. These activities will take place at and facilitated by The Great Aussie Bush Camp in Tea Gardens.

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Equipment Checklist

The checklist below is a guide only. It is a good idea for students to pack their own bags so that they can re pack for the trip home.

- Please clearly name all items
- Medication must be given to the organising teacher the morning of departure

What to Bring:

- Reusable water bottle
- Reusable plastic cup / mug
- Hat, sunscreen and insect repellent
- Sleeping bag and bottom sheet
- Day pack (small backpack for water, sunscreen, etc)
- Torch (make sure it works before you leave home)
- Toiletries
- 2 pairs of runners (1 old pair for water activities)
- Thongs only for going to and from showers
- 3 T-shirts
- 3 sets of underwear and socks
- 3 pairs of shorts
- Swim wear
- 1 pair of track pants
- 2 jumpers
- 2 towels
- Plastic bags for wet clothes / towel
- A small amount of money for the shops located near the kayaking venue

What not to Bring:

These items will be confiscated at the commencement of the camp.

- Mobile phone
- Electronic devices for gaming
- Valuable items that are not required for your stay
- Any banned school items

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Camp Guidelines and Rules

Students should be aware of these Guidelines:

- All students must adhere to the Department of Education's Covid Safe requirements and Youthworks' Covid Safe Business plan
- Never leave camp or an activity without permission.
- All activities must be supervised by a teacher and instructor.
- Listen to and follow teacher/instructor's guidelines.
- Closed in shoes and hats to be worn at all times.
- Enter no room other than your own.
- Respect the natural environment, use bins provided, don't damage the bush.
- No valuables, electronic equipment, or mobile phones are to be bought to camp.
- Do not approach, or attempt to pat the wildlife.
- All accidents / damage to equipment must be reported.
- Wilful damage will be paid for the individual(s) responsible.
- Do not eat or drink in cabins.
- No chewing gum to be brought to camp.
- Respect others after lights out. There should be no need to leave your cabins after lights out.
- Each group is responsible for the ongoing cleanliness of their room.
- To avoid accidents please do not run around the campsite areas.
- As a general rule, students will not be removed from activities as punishment, however will be given time out to reflect on their actions.
- Allocating extra duties or taking away free time may also be used for inappropriate behaviour
- We may exclude students whose behaviour could result in serious danger or distress to themselves or others. In extreme cases, the parents / guardians may be contacted and the student/s will be sent home.
